To all to whom these presents shall come: Greeting.

I know ye, that we, for and in Consideration of the sum of Ten pounds, for every hundred acres hereby granted, paid into our Treasury by John Spirey have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said John Spirey a tract of land containing Sixty five Acres, lying and being in our County of Craven on the west side of Pettigree Creek adjoining his old line, beginning at a Gum on the side of the Run of Poplar Branch then North west running, his old line two hundred and fourteen poles to the centre of two pines near a pond then South South West with his old line trees fifty two poles, so long as pine his old corner near a Branch then South fine East two hundred poles

to a pine on the side of a poplar Branch that took the first station down the various courses of poplar Branch run, as by the flat hereunto annexed cloth appears; together with all woods, waters, mines, minerals, hereditaments, and appurtenances to the said land belonging or appertaining to Hold to the said John Spirey his heirs and assigns forever yielding and paying long such sum of money, yearly, or otherwise, as our General Assembly from time to time may direct; provided always, that the said John Spirey shall cause this grant to be registered in the Register's Office of our said County of Craven within twelve months from the date hereof. Otherwise the same shall be void and of no effect. — In Testimony whereof we have caused these our letters to be made patent and our great seal thereto hereunto affixed.
